

FIRE SAFETY CHECKLIST FOR CHILD CARE - COMMERCIAL BUILDING (GROUP, CENTER, PRE-SCHOOL)

The International Fire Code (IFC), 2018 Edition has been adopted by the North Dakota State Fire Marshal's Office as rules for fire prevention of the State of North Dakota. Fire code violations shall be corrected immediately. Fire codes listed are not a comprehensive list and do not encompass all applicable codes, The noted code sections are commonly encountered and generally applicable to commercial buildings being used for childcare facilities.

• "Commercial Building" for the purposes of child care is defined as any "building licensed for over 30 children, or any building designed for commercial purposes" (regardless of the number of occupants).

Number of Exits Required - IFC 1006.2.1. New spaces and rooms occupied by more than 10 children under 2 1/2 years of age, nave access to not less than two exits or exit access doorways. Fire Rated Separations - IFC 701.2. Where required, existing fire-resistance rated construction is properly maintained.					
Fire Alarm System/Smoke Alarms - IFC 1103.7.1. A fire alarm system is ins 1,000 square feet, contain more than a single classroom, and have an occupate		ver			
*For buildings that do not meet the noted criteria, either single or multiple station room used for sleeping and located on every level outside the sleeping areas. documented.					
Carbon Monoxide System/Alarms - IFC 1103.9. Carbon monoxide alarms shall be installed in any child care building where there is a possible source of carbon monoxide. Carbon monoxide alarms are installed on each level of the building.					
Electrical Safety - IFC 604. Electrical panels have a working space of 36 inches in front of them. Extension cords shall not be used for permanent wiring. Electrical equipment and covers are properly maintained.					
Heating Systems - IFC 603. To reduce likelihood of accidental ignition of combustibles and/or flammables are kept a safe distance (i.e. 18") away from heating systems (i.e. furnace, water heater, etc.). Heating systems and equipment are properly maintained.					
Fire Extinguishers - IFC 906. The structure has an approved and properly maintained fire extinguisher on each level of the building, and within 75' of any point in the building. Fire extinguisher is accessible and annual maintenance is documented appropriately.					
Combustible Storage - IFC 315. Combustible storage is maintained in a way that does not pose a threat of fire. Attic, under-floor, and concealed spaces used for storage of combustible materials are protected with a fire rated barrier.					
Emergency Evacuation Drills - IFC 405. Emergency evacuation plan is maintained and posted. Emergency evacuation drills are conducted monthly (a minimum 4 "fire" drills required annually) and are documented.					
Exit Signs and Egress Lighting - IFC 1104.3 &1104.5. Exit signs and egress/emergency lighting are installed as required to mark and light exits, have emergency power back-up, and are properly maintained.					
Cooking Hood Suppression Systems - IFC 607. Where commercial cooking produces grease laden vapors that accumulate on walls or ceilings presenting a fire hazard, a type I hood ventilation system is required and is protected by a fire suppression system meeting the requirements of the IDFC.					
Sprinkler Systems - IFC 903.2.6. An automatic sprinkler system is required throughout new buildings/daycare facilities in areas used for daycare that are on any level other than ground floor.		as			
Existing daycare facilities limited to one level above or below ground level and with a second exit that leads directly outside and to the ground level (i.e. exterior exit stairway), are not required to install an automatic sprinkler.
